Remit 1: Establishing an Autonomous National Indigenous Organization has passed!

All 16 Regional Councils, the National Indigenous Council, and just over 80% of pastoral charges in The United Church of Canada voted in the recent remit process. Huge thanks to all who participated in learning spaces, especially Indigenous knowledge keepers; to all who were on the phoning teams that helped push us into a large majority voting on the remit; and to all who voted, participated, and learned together. The planning committee has decided to restructure our AGM meeting originally planned for May 2 and 9. We will now meet **May 9 and October 24**.

We will reconvene on **Thursday October 24 from 6:30 - 8:30 pm** on Zoom. At this time we will elect 11 General Council 45 Commissioners, and focus on other business such as proposals. Another opportunity to gather as a Regional Council and communities of faith will take place Saturday June 1 at 2:00PM at Mill Woods United Church in Edmonton. Through a worship service and Pride picnic to follow, we will celebrate our Regional Council becoming officially Affirming, and welcome Carrie Symondson into ordained ministry! ★ Invitation: conversation with the family of Morgan Harris, Search the Landfill, Sunday April 21

Please join the national church's Indigenous Ministries and Justice from **4:00 to 5:30**PM MDT on Sunday April **21** for a conversation with the family of Morgan Harris. Morgan is one of the Missing and Murdered Indigenous Women whose remains are believed to be in the landfill near Winnipeg. Her daughter Cambria Harris will join us in this United in Learning webinar to raise awareness of the landfill search and the challenges that the families and loved ones of MMIWG2S face. We hope that this webinar will also help us all become stronger advocates and better allies in the Search the Landfill movement, and in efforts to stop the continued very high rates of violence that target Indigenous women, girls and Two Spirit people. Being Good Relations Network News: plan ahead for these important upcoming dates

The Being Right Relations Network encompasses both Chinook Winds and Northern Spirit Regions. Two important Indigenous Special Days occur in May. We urge all United Churches to honour these two days and try to educate people in your community.

May 5 - Red Dress Day: Red Dress Day honours the memories of missing and murdered Indigenous women and girls across Canada. In 2010 Métis artist Jaime Black helped inspire the red dress movement, where red dresses are hung from windows and trees to represent the pain and loss felt by loved ones and survivors. May 16 Moose Hide Day: Moose hide Campaign is a grass roots movement for Indigenous and Non-Indigenous men and boys who are standing up against violence towards women and girls. It's a day of ceremony where all Canadians are called together to take a stand against violence towards women and children and to take practical steps for our collective journey of reconciliation. Alberta's proposed transgender legislation and new Regional Council action resource

This renewed invitation is for everyone! Walk or roll together in your own community. Pray and act for a ceasefire, and for more than a ceasefire- for a just peace for all in Palestine and Israel. Then, if you can, join national church leaders for the final leg of their pilgrimage. KAIROS member church leaders, including Moderator Carmen Lansdowne, will gather in Ottawa on May 22-23 to bring these calls in person to the Government of Canada and Parliamentarians.
