★ Our Sacred Obligations: learning from the Unmarked Burials report and challenging settler denial, Thursday February 27, 10 am - 4 pm, Southminster-Steinhauer United Church, Edmonton, in person and by Zoom

All welcome to this day-long learning gathering, open to Indigenous and non-Indigenous people. We will focus on the United Church's national and local responsibilities, but all backgrounds are welcome as a full part of the day. Together we will learn about the recent report on unmarked burials; explore what reparations means; learn about the problem of settler denialism; and practice together how to challenge it.

Community, prayer, traditional ceremony, and cultural supports will be part of our day.
